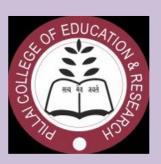

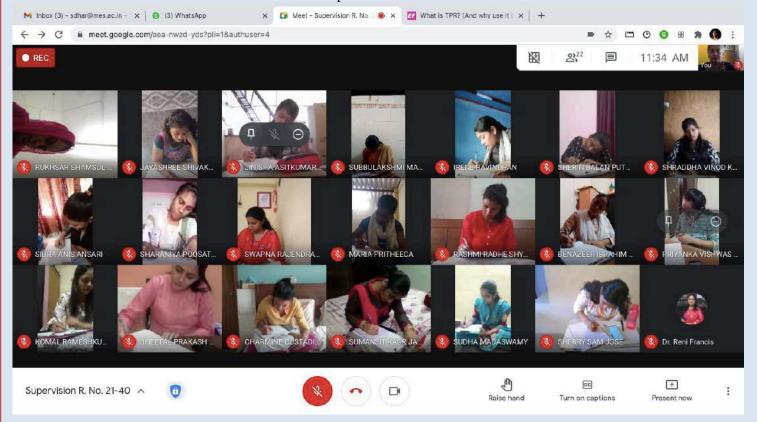
University Examinations



After successfully completing the Semester IV, B. Ed. examinations for the Batch of 2018-20 in October, PCER, Chembur successfully completed the University examinations for the students of Semester III, Batch of 2019-21.

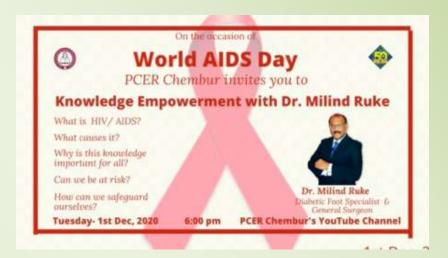
This time, the examinations were conducted via Google Classrooms. As per the University decision taken during this Pandemic time, the 60 mark examination for each of the three courses was divided into two parts. The first part consisted of multiple choice questions (MCQs) and carried 30 marks whereas the second part consisted of answering 10 descriptive questions each carrying 3 marks.

PCER, Chembur created a special Google Classroom for conducting the Examinations. Mock tests were held on the 12th, 14th and the 15th of December, 2020 followed by an interaction on Google Meet where the doubts of the students were clarified and instructions for the upcoming final examinations given. The final University examinations were successfully completed on the 19th, 21st and 23rd December, 2020. Both the mock tests and the final examinations were conducted under online supervision.





World AIDS Day



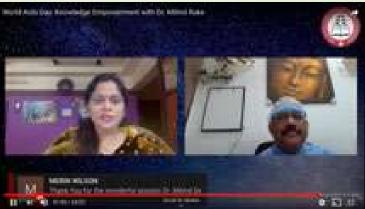
On the 1st of December, 2020, PCER, Chembur, in order to commemorate the occasion of World AIDS Day, organized an online session with Dr. Milind Ruke. The event was streamed live on PCER Chembur's YouTube channel.

Dr. Ruke is a diabetic foot specialist and a general surgeon from Ashirwaad Hospital, Chembur, who has more than 30 years of experience in the medical field. He spoke to all teachers and students about the nitty-gritty of the human immune system and how one is affected by the human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) and acquires the immunedeficiency syndrome or AIDS. He also destroyed some myths about patients with AIDS and elaborated the caution and care to be taken by all.

He reiterated that AIDS is a disease which is not inevitable and with some knowledge and a few precautions, it can be avoided by all.

International Virtual Conference on Innovative and Sustainable Educational Practices in Higher Education

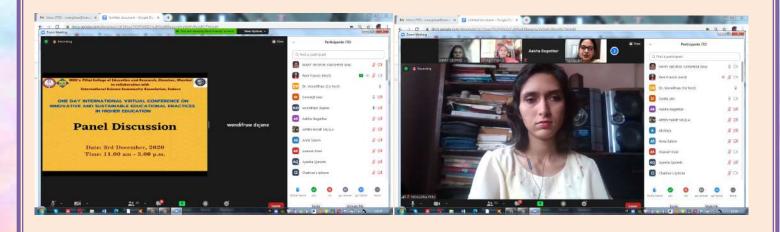

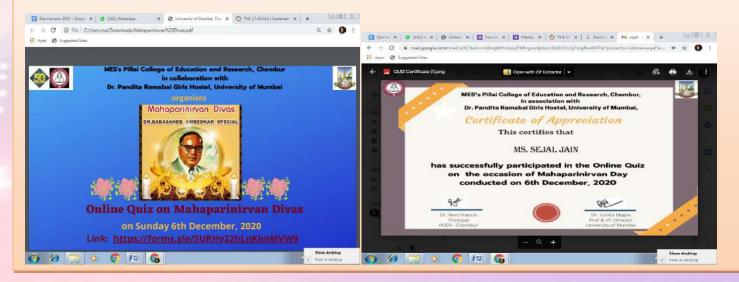




Online Quiz- Mahaparinirvan Divas
