






#### **CREATIVE TALKS**

## SESSION ON MENTAL HEALTH



On 11<sup>th</sup> March, 2020, Ms. Yvette Lee, a Counsellor at Mahatma Education Society took a session on Mental Health with the students of FY as well as the SY. She laid special emphasis on the use of Rational Emotive Behaviour Therapy (REBT) as proposed by Carl Rogers and examples of how the ABCDE Model can be applied to real life situations.

The ABCDE model speaks about focusing on identifying the activating event (A) which is triggered by a belief (B) resulting in a consequence (C). Generally this consequence is harmful or unhealthy and the individual want to change the consequence (for the better). This leads to disputing the existing belief (D) and the launch of newer and better events (E).

#### SESSION ON MATHEMATICS DAY



Mahatma Education Society's Pillai College of Education and Research, Chembur celebrated 'The International Day of Mathematics (IDM)'\_on 14<sup>th</sup> March, 2020 on this year's theme 'Mathematics is everywhere' by organizing an expert talk by Mr.Gyanendra Pratap Singh, HOD of Department of Mathematics of Dr. Pillai Global Academy, New Panvel.



He highlighted the importance of mathematics in our everyday life like how Mathematics help plan and manage economic and social systems, GPS systems, mathematical models etc. He also briefly described the history and origin of the p (Pi). The session was very informative and B.Ed students requested to have such more sessions on Mathematics in near future.

#### TEACHING AID COMPETITION

It also gave practical or commercial utilization of the research and find out the things that are out of the scope with the current study. The session focused on the need of Literature review, the topics of Literature review, the significance of the same in research and the way a Literature Review should be organized.

#### ⇒ Online session: Knowing your Wellbeing on 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2020,

Zoom Session for **FY B.Ed.** student teachers during COVID – 19 Lockdown was done on the topic 'Knowing your Well-being.
