The driving force and the youth of the world, when they start to think about the progress of the entire human race in all possible directions, can only be a true step towards internationalism
























Faculty Achievements


This book comprises many articles and papers submitted by women entrepreneurs who expressed their views about how the world can refocus itself keeping the present crisis in mind.


University Semester 1 Exams


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Alumni Corner
