
Webinar on 'Enabling a perfect research ecosystem with Scopus, Science Direct and Mendeley'

Common Errors in Communication



The session focused on the importance of communicating correctly and conveying ones' thoughts and ideas in a clear and concise manner. The session highlighted the common errors committed during communication in English language such as usage of wrong plurals, the importance of adding the modal after a 'Wh' word, use of can/may/could. The session also highlighted the importance of correct pronunciations, introducing oneself correctly and the right use of prepositions and articles for grammatically correct sentences. Students were also advised to refer to dictionaries and conduct spell check to avoid spelling errors. The session concluded with a general discussion on the students' queries regarding correct English language usage

SWOC Analysis

Self awareness is crucial as a well adjusted adult. Teachers need to be aware of their strengths and weaknesses and the sessions gave them the opportunity to self reflect and explore these for themselves. Student teachers on the brink of exploring the world of work need to be well equipped not only with their knowledge and skills related to teaching, but also their knowledge about themselves, awareness of the levels of their skills and developing the right attitudes towards their students.

Navigating the complexities of the job market in a post pandemic world makes it imperative that student teachers start off on the right foot; ensuring a quality, effective resume and cover letter. This is an opportunity for one to present their best selves to prospective employers.




How To Face An Interview



This session focused on the various aspects that are part of a job interview. what you now have was once among the things you only hoped for."




Assembly




A Vote of thanks was proposed by Shelina, who thanked the principal, teachers and all those who contributed towards the conduct of the event.
