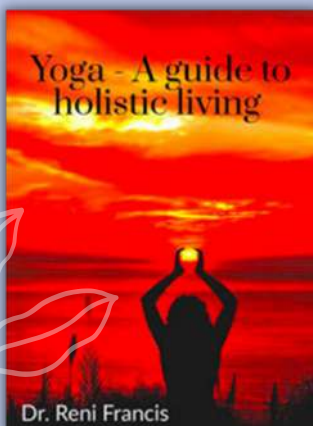
PCER Chembur, geared up for the academic year 2022-2023 with a bang. Almost all teachers contributed to the research arena utilizing the summer break to the fullest.

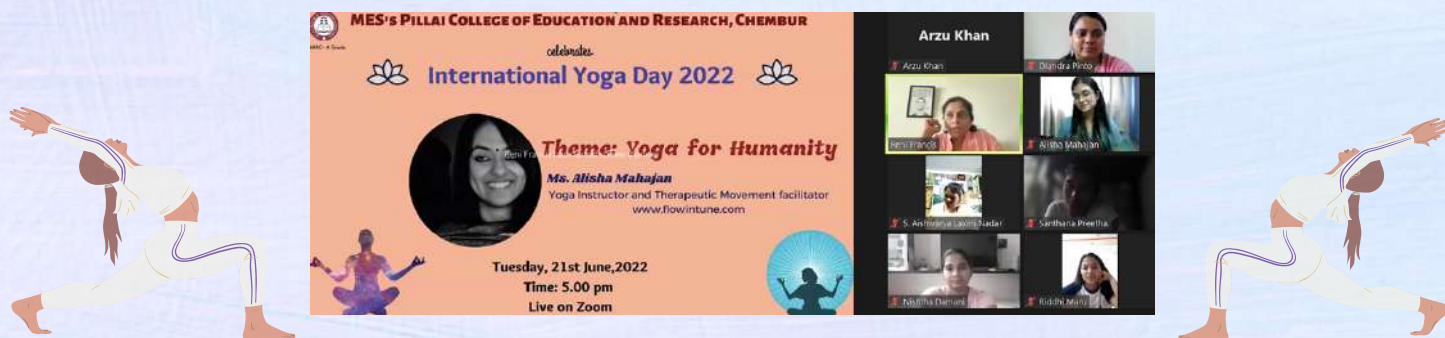
The chief Guests enlightened the students about the importance of the World Environment Day and also planted some saplings in the college Campus.
