The drive to learn, the momentum to accelerate the process of learning and the achievement of success lies in your hands.


So take this opportunity to harness your skill and make it a priority and move ahead in life.

As the monsoons lash our city this July, it is worth paying tribute to mother nature as we celebrate the World Nature Conservation Day and World Tiger Day on the 28th and 29th of this month.

We tend to take mother nature for granted. The silent support received is what leads to us taking nature for granted. Nature and specifically forests are known as the lungs of the earth. Without a good forest cover the earth cannot maintain the balance of oxygen and carbon dioxide in the atmosphere. This balance needs to be maintained so that plants can provide oxygen to animals and humans for respiration. Moreover trees also are responsible for attracting rainfall through transpiration that raises water vapour in the atmosphere that rises and forms rain clouds that then return in as rain. It is crucial to remember that all of nature works together as an interdependent ecosystem. While human progress and development has destroyed certain elements, it impacts several other parts of the ecosystem. However, the reverse also works in our favour, if humans make some amount of effort to heal and repair parts of nature, the efforts do help improve the entire ecosystem as a whole.

Tigers are at the apex of the food cycle. They maintain the right balance of animals in the forest as they along with other predators keep a check on the herbivore animals. This can prevent deforestation and thus one tiger can protect several acres of forest in this way. If a species goes extinct it impacts the entire ecosystem. Forests are also water catchment areas and thus the ecosystems of nature and animals are very much interdependent. Therefore, World Tiger Day is not just about raising awareness for conservation about tigers, but its impact extends to the wider ecosystem as well.

What can we do? As individuals we can avoid patronizing parks and centers that use drugged tigers and other such animals as entertainment and moreover, practicing responsible and sustainable tourism when visiting tiger reserves or any nature reserves. The future of the planet depends on the actions we take today, so any positive action on our part today can ensure a better planet for tomorrow.

#### शिक्षा की आवश्यकता


