#### **EDITORIAL**

#### A KINDER WORLD BEGINS WITH US

Every day when we read the newspaper, we come across upsetting news. Children bullying others, young people losing hope, crimes done out of anger, and different kinds of abuse. I often stop and think: if this hurts me so much to read, how are others feeling? Or have we all become so used to such stories that we just turn the page and move on?

With so many fights, conflicts, and wars around us, one question keeps coming back — what will it take for the world to be kinder?

We celebrate World Kindness Day on November 13th each year. It's a nice reminder. But kindness can't be limited to one day. It has to be something we practice daily. Do we try to cheer someone up when they're sad? Do we make an effort to be gentle with people, even when we're hurt? Most of the time, the answer is no.

We call ourselves the most intelligent beings on the planet, but we struggle with simple kindness. Even street animals, who only want to survive and be friendly, face our impatience and cruelty. If we cannot be kind to them, how will we ever learn to be kind to each other?

Maybe what we need is a little more empathy. A small pause before reacting. A moment to think: why did this person behave this way? How will my response affect them and me? These small thoughts can change how we treat people.






## **National Entrepreneurs Day**




### **Digital Poster Making**



The International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women is observed every year on 25th November to raise awareness about the widespread and deeply rooted problem of violence faced by women and girls across the world. This observance highlights all forms of violence—physical, emotional, psychological, sexual, digital, and economic—and recognizes that such violence is a violation of human rights. #### **Language Club Activity**



In the month of November students of PCER Chembur began with the audiobook of the first of the Harry Potter series, "Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone". #### **Job Perfect Series**



PCER conducted a value added course Being Job Perfect for the S.Y.B.Ed students in preparation for the placement process. The sessions for the course were initiated in November 2025. The course is designed to update their knowledge and build various skills essential for effective participation in the recruitment process. The sessions focused on aspects that will enable the student teachers to enter into the job world with confidence and optimism. The sessions conducted as part of the course included- 21st Century Skills, Effective Communication, Different School Boards, Resume Writing, Facing an Interview, Teamwork and Collaboration, SEL-Social Emotional Learning, Professional Étiquettes, Digital Learning etc.





#### **Alumni Session**

A session to enhance student teachers' awareness of the different school boards was conducted on 19th November 2025. The resource person for the session was Dr. Farah Shaikh, PCER Chembur alumna and IB Physics teacher, Dr. Pillai Global Academy, Gorai.
